FCC's Reforms Target our Bottom Line

At the West Central Telephone Annual Meeting held in May, we focused on the implications the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) Universal Service Fund (USF) and Intercarrier Compensation (ICC) reforms could have on our cooperative—particularly on our fiber-optic construction projects. We planned to complete the Fiber to the Home project this year, bringing fiber to rural Sebeka and Wolf Lake residents, but have put our plans on hold until we are clear on how these new rules will affect our cooperative.

The FCC's Order, which was released in November, is vague in many areas, with deadlines looming but no clear direction or mechanisms in place to carry them out. After reading through the 740-page Order, we are still unclear as to how much the changes will affect our bottom line. However, it is clear that the cooperative will lose revenue.

Although WCTA generates revenue through diversifications sources like renewable energy

and surveillance cameras, the three main revenue sources come from customers, USF, and ICC. Under the FCC's Reform Order, we will face significant loss of two of the three revenue sources, the USF and ICC, both of which were designed to help make it possible for small carriers like WCTA to help build the telecommunications network that the entire nation uses. While there will be new funds for broadband expansion, it is unclear how that will replace the large investments we have already made.

At this time, we are confident that we can continue the Fiber to the Home project using general funds and breaking the project up into three or four smaller phases. **We will keep you informed; however, your voice and opinion can make a difference by contacting members of Congress. New Wi-Fi Hotspot in Sebekka

Visitors to the Sebekka Park and Campground will now have high speed Internet access via a Wi-Fi hotspot. While the service is provided by West Central Telephone, it's been made a reality in part through the Technical Assistance Fund grant and the Minnesota Intelligent Rural Communities (MIRC). MIRC is a coalition, under the Blandin Foundation, working to bring resources and support to rural communities through education and broadband adoption.

The community of Sebekka felt that creating a public high speed Wi-Fi hotspot would be an asset to their community and help promote the area to businesses and individuals looking to relocate in a rural setting. Campers and visitors to the area will be able to stay connected with their work, friends, and family through the superfast access point, and at no cost. This is available to all, so grab your laptop and head over to the Sebekka Park for part of your workday.

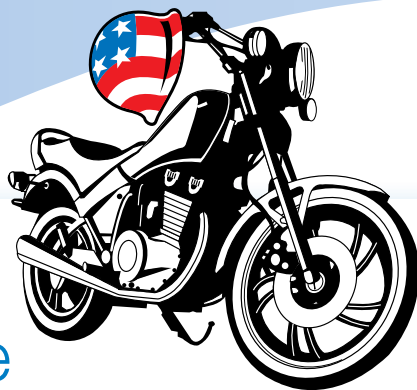


FCC Establishes Access Recovery Charge

As part of the Universal Service Fund (USF) Reform, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) released an Order late last year establishing the Access Recovery Charge (ARC) in order to transition a portion of the costs of providing service in high cost areas to the end user customer. The FCC believes that more of the cost of providing service in rural areas should be the customer's responsibility rather than supported by the USF.

The ARC is applicable to both residential and business customers, with residential customers incurring \$0.50 per month and business customers incurring \$1.00 per month per line. The new fee will be billed effective July 1, 2012.

A *Pinterest*-ing Way to Collect and Connect

Pinterest (www.pinterest.com) offers a virtual place to house collections of the images you believe are beautiful, funny, important, or otherwise interesting. On a Pinterest pinboard, you can even collect intangibles like the snippets of stories, sayings, and ideas you used to tack onto a bulletin board or glue into your scrapbook.

Most Pinterest users are women (80 percent, according to a recent Google Ad Planner inquiry by Ignite Social Media), so collections tend toward fashion, cooking, home décor, crafts, and children. Men tend to collect images related to automobiles, sports, men's fashion, gadgets, and travel. Practically everyone on Pinterest collects images representing movies, music, books, humor, and inspiring sayings.

The beauty of Pinterest is you can collect whatever strikes your fancy. Pinboards are personal and often highly unique. You get a sense of who people are by looking at their pinboards and pins. If you like what you see, you can follow them or click on their pins and Repin them on your own boards. You also can add pins to your Like list or Comment on them. You can even click on a pin and go to its original source to find out more. Click on names, pins, and boards in activity feeds to see new things and meet new people.

You can use Pinterest pinboards to help you accomplish tasks from big to small. Collect ideas to help plan a wedding, decorate a home, organize recipes, document your style, or organize your office. Pinterest is an invitation-only website, so to get started you need to ask a friend who's already on the site to invite you. Once you receive your email invitation, you simply click the link to set up your account. The Pinterest wizard will take you through the steps, and you can start pinning!
